Olympia And Battle Ground

Saturday, July 16 and Overnight in Olympia

I've got great news. The traditional double-header day of parade marching at Battle Ground and Olympia is offered with some huge improvements! Sign up for the two parades and now have the opportunity to stay the night in Olympia. Enjoy the famous Lakefair Clam Bake dinner Saturday evening. This is one of the west coast's best clam bakes, something we have not been able to do

because the bus left too early. We are talking clams, shrimp, and oysters (or hamburgers if you are not shellfishly inclined).

Rosie the Bus will transport Rosarians and guests from the Red Lion in Jantzen Beach to Battle Ground where we'll march in their popular Harvest Days parade, followed by a rose planting for the Battle Ground Citizen of the Year. Rosie will then head north to Olympia for Capital Lakefair Festival's Rose Planting. Following the Rose Planting in Olympia, the bus will transport us to the Red Lion in Olympia where we will check in and relax until it is time to assemble for the parade. The bus will then take us to the parade start and when we get done with the Olympia Parade, the bus will take us back to the Olympia Red Lion where we will get into our comfy's and sit on the grassy banks of the Red Lion Hotel overlooking the lake and enjoy a sumptuous feast of seafood or burgers.

I can't think of a more perfect day. Marching in the Battle Ground parade, planting a rose honoring our long tradition in Battle Ground, riding the bus up to Olympia, planting a rose honoring Capital Lakefair, checking into the hotel, relaxing, then marching in the Lakefair parade, then the clam bake, and sleep at Red Lion, heading home Sunday morning.

The typical Battle Ground/Olympia day is ugly long, including a long hot wait after the Olympia rose planting before the Lakefair parade, and then a long & late bus ride home after the second parade. Not anymore!

Right now they have extended their room block by 10 rooms for Saturday night. Do not wait as this will surely sell out.
