Rosarians who work as Officers, Directors and Helpers for your Royal Rosarian Foundation show up at every meeting and address every task with an open heart. They discuss issues thoughtfully and with respect for others' viewpoints, while being good stewards of your money.

I am so grateful for their dedication and good work. By comparison to most other foundations, we are small potatoes. We are not building stadiums or funding breakthrough medical cures or sending someone to Mars. We don't have the financial strength to make "grand gestures." But in the thirty years of our organization's existence, by "quiet persistence," we are making a positive difference in our community.

Consider, for example, our unique Field Trip Program. In 2009, we sent \$7,500 to ten Portland schools. This year we sent checks totaling \$35,000 to forty-one elementary schools in four Portland-area school districts, extending off-site educational opportunities for approximately 12,000 young students.

Also this year we've taken several important steps to maximize our future funding. We established an endowment fund, thanks especially to a significant donation from the Wayne and Cathy Felder estate, and we opened an interest-bearing savings account so our operating money would receive a better rate. We are continually looking for ways to stretch the donations we receive.

Foundation Helpers

"How can I help?" may be one of the most appreciated questions in the English language.

The Rosarian Foundation relies heavily on its "Helpers" to get work done. "Helpers" are those Rosarians who regularly attend Foundation meetings, participate in discussions, and work on all tasks. They do some of the same jobs the Directors do, except voting or holding a Foundation position.

Helpers come to the Foundation board primarily in two ways. Most of them come as new or almost new Rosarians. They have giving hearts, believe in our charitable work, and want to get involved. Over the years, other helpers, who were previously involved as Directors, returned after an absence to assist the Foundation board. Some include Scott Stuhl, Bob Strader, Barb Brennan, and Mark Sleasman. We always welcome them back, whether they were term-limited or simply stepped away to pursue other interests. Their experience is invaluable. This year, we relied heavily on helpers Connie Shipley to chair the Milk Carton Boat Races, Marti Penske to continue as our representative to the Community Transitional School, and Mike Ware to serve on our investment committee.

Historically, the Rosarian with the most years of experience on the RRF board is Duke Scott Stuhl, who has served as a director for at least fourteen years, in addition to the gap years he spent as a helper. When he retires from the Board at the end of this year, we hope he will again become a helper.

Our helpers create a strong bench from which we can choose replacements to fill unexpected vacancies or nominees for the next election. Helpers are familiar with our projects and our methods of operation, and they can seamlessly fill positions that become available. We thank them all!

Whether it's the fresh ideas, energy, and enthusiasm of newer members or the pragmatic application of experience from our long-time Rosarians, all our helpers, combined with our Directors, make our Foundation a strong and productive organization.

She shared that "the school has added an after-school leadership program for its middle schoolers and held its first meeting on April 4th. Some of the group's responsibilities will include popping popcorn on Fridays, distributing it to customers at recess, cleaning the popcorn machine, counting the proceeds, and creating new posters to track the profit. The money raised is donated to Smile Train and to help build wells in West Ghana. Members will also be responsible for giving tours to visitors and tell them about CTS from a student's perspective – always interesting."

The Foundation Investment Committee is composed of Royal Rosarians who have met regularly with a representative of Peregrine Asset Advisors, our professional financial company, since 2013 and report quarterly to our Foundation Board with updates and recommendations as needed.

Peregrine continues to manage the Foundation's assets under its care in accordance with the objectives and guidelines outlined in a policy developed by the Foundation Board. Typically, our asset earnings exceed expectations.

Gordon Walker has served as Chairman of the committee for many years, and he and Virgil Caramella were charter members in 2010. Current committee members also include Nate Aazzerah, Matt Clark, and Mike Ware. As Foundation Vice President, Katherine Johnson is the official liaison from the Investment Committee to the Foundation Board.

We thank all members of this important committee for their stewardship of our funds, and especially Gordon and Virgil for their long years of service.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

As is customary, the Foundation Board's Investment Committee met last month to review the results of the First Quarter of 2025. The results of the aforementioned meeting were provided to the Foundation Board at their meeting of April 23rd.

Before this meeting, the Foundation Board received copies of the quarterly reports. Although we experienced a loss in our investment portfolio of over \$2,900 or 1.6%, it was a surprise given the small amount, given the less-than-stellar performance and fluctuations of the market during the First Quarter. In what might be viewed as a positive, our Investment Advisor, Dan Botti, stated that we fared far better than many of his clients.

We also discussed the individual investments in our portfolio and determined that no investment changes were needed at this time. In addition, the Asset Allocation Guidelines, as set forth in our Investment Policy Statement, were reviewed and found to be in compliance. The Foundation Board approved the report.

Easy and Free Ways to Support Your Foundation

Your Royal Rosarian Foundation is partnering with two organizations to raise funds for the Foundation.

The **BottleDrop** program is an easy way to support your Royal Rosarian Foundation. So far this fiscal year, the Foundation received \$850 from the bottles turned in from October 1 through May 26. \$450 was just deposited in May so it is not reflected on the list of donations above.

Here is what you need to do:

1. Get a blue bag with a sticker from Barb Brennan
2. Fill the bag with redeemable bottles and cans
3. Tie the bag firmly
4. Drop off your bag at a Bottle Drop site <https://bottledrop.com/locations>
 - a. To deposit the bags, scan the label's QR code at the deposit site and put the bag inside. **Hint: Make sure the red 'crosshair' from the scanner appears on the label's QR code. You'll hear a 'click' from the door when the scanner has identified the label.**
5. Contact me to get another Blue Bag!

Additionally, if you already have a BottleDrop Green Bag account, you can donate any amount of your account balance to the Foundation.

1. Sign in to your individual BottleDrop account (online or app) <https://bottledrop.com>
2. Search for and select Royal Rosarian Foundation, then click through to the donation page
3. Enter your donation amount, then click 'Donate Now.'

Sign up for the **Fred Meyer Community Rewards** program, and Fred Meyer will take care of the rest. In first quarter 2025 the Foundation received \$81.34 through this program with 40 participating families. You need a Fred Meyer Shopper's Card and an online account.

1. Go to www.fredmeyer.com/communityrewards, then follow the steps listed there.
 - a. Select Royal Rosarian Foundation (Organization Number DX607)
2. If you have registered before, please check your account to ensure the Royal Rosarian Foundation is still your selected organization. Every few years, Fred Meyer will email you to confirm your selection. Fred Meyer automatically removes your account from the program if you don't confirm your selection.
3. If you have difficulty signing up or confirming the Royal Rosarian Foundation, don't hesitate to contact me.
